'Vespa The Hong Kong Story' photo exhibition is being extended to **Lee Tung Avenue**, not only promoting Vintage Vespa's golden period in Hong Kong, but also paying tribute to the first local Vespa agent – 'Bowrington Motors' which was located in the Wan Chai neigbourhood.

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About Vespa

In light of the destruction during the WWII which made the road uneven and bumpy, Italian vehicle manufacturer Piaggio unveiled Vespa - an innovative mode of transport with a light, brilliant design, in April 1946. The first model Vespa 98 had become the earliest scooter ever. Vespa went viral in Italy and across the globe after its appearance in the movie 'Roman Holiday' in 1953, and later seen on roads in Hong Kong, which had become the vehicle of the police force, government officials and public organizations. The simplicity of its design is beloved by enthusiasts and riders of delivery services, and was once remodelled to an ice cream hawker car.

About Lee Tung Avenue

Lee Tung Avenue features a 200-metre tree-lined boulevard on Hong Kong Island. It is home to alfresco cafes, gourmet restaurants and boutiques, offering selected local and overseas brands. Lee Tung Avenue
