International Art Installation Heralds Hong Kong's Arts Month 'Living Painting' Grows from the City for the Public to be Part of It

Hong Kong, 2 March 2018..... Lee Tung Avenue is delighted to present an avant-garde public art commission, 'In the Mood For Love', by international, award-winning artist Sinta Tantra, to celebrate Hong Kong's arts month. Making the most of the unique *mise-en-scène* and ambience of Lee Tung Avenue, the art installation by Sinta 'encourages the general public to look, relook and step inside; circular shapes makes one feel uplifted while solid, bright colours are pleasing and life-affirming'. Lee Tung Avenue and Sinta Tantra welcome and invite everyone to be part of this 'living painting'.

UK-based artist Sinta Tantra is well known for public art installations and her bold, geometric style that make wide use of shapes, lines and vibrant palettes. Her notable public work includes 'A Beautiful Sunset Mistaken for a Dawn', a 300-metre painted bridge at Canary Wharf in London and a permanent landmark commission for the 2012 Olympics.

'In the Mood For Love' is the critically-acclaimed artist's first public art commission in Hong Kong. Taking inspirations from Lee Tung Avenue's love and romance heritage and vibrancy, and paying tribute to traditional Chinese colours, symbols and decorative motifs, the public art piece looks at and celebrates the idea of 'falling in love'. 'I want to create a visual spectacle of colours at both ends of the avenue, punctuating the space with abstract forms – symbols of love, wedding rings, romance and cultural heritage,' says Sinta.

In love with the city

The art installation runs across the tree-lined boulevard horizontally and vertically, transforming the alfresco space into a city landscape growing from the city. Brightly coloured graphics wrap across three levels of the footbridge as well as large-scale floor paintings to both entrances of Queen's Road and Johnston Road – looking up, looking down, stepping inside, submerged in colours, in love with the city itself.

In addition to appreciating art in an avant-garde, three-dimensional manner, gaze, presence and footsteps of passers-by on the 'living painting' are precious moments for another art piece – a time-lapse video. Photographic angles are specifically adjusted so that guests will be surrounded by the visual spectacle perfectly, focusing on the photographed person as 'a still point of the turning world'. This large-scale and inspirational outdoor art installation is a must-visit bright spot in Hong Kong's arts month.

A British artist of Balinese descent, Sinta Tantra was born in New York in 1979. She studied at the Slade School of Fine Art, University College London (1999–2003) and at the Royal Academy Schools London (2004–2006).

Her commissions include; Folkestone Triennial (2017) Newnham College, Cambridge University (2016); Songdo South Korea (2015); Sinta's most notable public work includes a 300-metre painted bridge at Canary Wharf in London commissioned for the 2012 Olympics.

Sinta is a recipient of many awards, including the prestigious Bridget Riley Drawing Fellowship at The British School at Rome (2017); she has been shortlisted for the Jerwood Contemporary Painting Prize (2015); British



Council's International Development Award (2014) and Deutsche Bank Award (2006).
